Admissions Policy

The aim of the Admissions procedure at Roedean is to ensure that girls who join the school find that it is a place where they can flourish in a wide variety of areas: academically, socially, and in the field of extra curricular activities. We are looking for students who are prepared to make the most of the opportunities which exist here.

We encourage prospective pupils to visit the school, possibly on a number of occasions, so that they and their family can gain as full a picture of the school as possible.

The procedure for selection which follows registration includes an interview at the school, a request for a confidential report from the candidate's current school, and success in the entrance examination.

The school does not discriminate on grounds of race or creed. It is important, however, that those intending to join the school are comfortable with values and practices followed according to the Christian character of the school. We seek to apply our admissions criteria fairly and sensitively, and regardless of an applicant's disability.

Through the Brighthelm Award and our bursary scheme we seek to widen access to the school to girls who can clearly and substantially benefit from a Roedean education regardless of their parents' means.
